Q: When is the course Delivered?

A: The course will be run on 3 consecutive afternoons 1300-1730 Hrs BRAVO on 20-22 April 2021

Q: What is the aim of the course?

A: The aim of the course is to enhance the capacity of the Chair of Boards and Working Groups to undertake their roles and responsibilities for joint synchronisation more effectively.

Q: What is the Target Audience?

A: OF5 and OF6 who are Chairs of Boards and Working Groups in Operational level HQs or SSC and their Board/WG Secretaries. GRF(L) HQs preparing as JFTs are also welcome.

Q: Who is eligible to attend?

A: 15 places are available on this course for delegates representing NCA and NFS HQs, JWC, JFTC, and those HQs preparing for LTRP, and selected Partner Nations of Australia, Finland, New Zealand and Sweden.

Q: What is the security classification?

A: The course is NATO UNCLASSIFIED

A: To gain the full benefit, you should attend all 3 afternoon sessions.
